

Bayswater Primary School Contributions, Charges and Personal Items Lists 2025

The School Board at Bayswater Primary School has endorsed the Schedule of Voluntary Contributions, Voluntary Approved Requests, Personal Items for Student Use, and charges for 2025. The schedule will assist you to calculate all costs that may be incurred during the school year.

School Voluntary Contributions

In accordance with School Education Regulations, schools can request up to a maximum voluntary contribution of \$60.00 for each child. The funds supplement the cost of materials used by students in the educational programs over a range of areas to ensure that all students benefit from the contributions. The 2025 School Voluntary Contribution for Kindergarten to Year 6 is \$60.00 per child.

Additional Approved Voluntary Requests

In addition to the School's Voluntary Contribution, the School Board has endorsed additional voluntary requests to support the schools targeted initiatives.

Technology Fund (\$40 per child)

This fund will assist in purchasing and maintaining computers, iPads, and purchasing digital technology curriculum resources.

School Priority Programs (\$30 per child)

This fund will assist in purchasing resources for priorities identified through the School Business Plan, such as literacy, numeracy, staff professional development and wellbeing.

Parents and Citizens' Associations (\$30 per child)

This will supplement the P&C fundraising efforts and enable it to support school initiatives and focus areas to meet the needs of our children.

Personal Items for Student Use

The School Board has approved the 2025 Personal Items for Student Use lists (Booklists) to a maximum value of \$170. The items can be purchased through Campion or a supplier of your own choice.

Prime Maths Workbooks

The Prime Mathematics Student Workbook A and B will be distributed through the school to all students, at the beginning of the year. The total cost of the two workbooks is **\$33.60** with payment to be made to the school by **Week 5 Term 1 2025**, via Qkr, direct deposit or eftpos.

Extra Cost Options Components

Activities that enrich the educational program will be offered to students throughout the year and may vary at each year level. These activities are not covered by the voluntary contributions.

The table below is a summary of the optional components and the maximum anticipated payment for 2025. The optional extra cost activities will not exceed the costs shown.

Projected Optional Extra Costs;

- 1. Year 6 Graduating Activities
 - The estimated graduation excursion and dinner cost is up to \$80.
- 2. Year 6 Camp Total cost will be reduced based on the amount of fundraising.
- Year 6 Leavers Polo and Jacket
 The Year 6 Leavers/Graduation polos and jackets. Estimated costs for graduation polos are up to
 \$40 and the graduation jackets \$70. Orders for the Leavers/Graduation polo shirts and jackets need
 to be placed directly by parents through Uniform Concepts in early Term 1, 2025.
- 4. JFSC Music Program (IMMS) Year 5 and Year 6 Select students in Year's 5 & 6 may be offered a position in the JFSC Instrumental Music Program. From 2025 payments will need to be made to Bayswater PS, \$40 to participate in the JFSC music program and JFSC musical instrument hire is \$130 to hire.
- 5. Primary Extension and Challenge (PEAC) and Early Years Extension (EYE) Program PEAC and EYE course details, costs and the registration process will be made available to parents by the North Metropolitan PEAC Centre in 2025. Course payments are to be made to Bayswater Primary School.

Optional Costs or Services

These include school photo day, student charitable fundraising, Year 6 camp fundraising, P&C fundraising events, and Scholastic Book Club.

Payment Methods & Financial Arrangements

A range of payment options are available and may be negotiated with the school. Voluntary Contributions may be paid with the Personal Items List or at any time as a single contribution or by a payment plan with the school, to spread payments throughout the year. Payments can be made by via the QKR app, direct deposit/ bank transfer or eftpos through the office.
